








Strategic analysis

Modal Split im Vergleich (in %)




2025: increase 10% pedestrians

Strategic assessment



Pedestrian Quality Check: retailers, school, citizen

Behaviour, observation, audits, questionnaires:

→ wishes, suggestions, barriers, i.e.:

- High walking potential, awareness for pedestrian issues: small sidewalks with inappropriate surface (e.g.: Rathausg., Wielandg.)


- Problems:

small pavement (e.g.: Radmannsdorf., Dr. Karl-Renner-G., Ledererg., Hauptplatz, near fire department,...),

crossings: more pedestrian-friendly,
more pedestrian quality in public space

(more shadow, benches; less noise, pollution, traffic...)

more splitted walk- and cycle paths – less mix



Priorities and indicators

- strategic action for pedestrian measures:
„Weiz good on foot - in the mobility chain”
(→ infrastructure, → cross all departments, → image)
- pleasant interfaces / mobility alternatives (public transport, bike)
- increase of quality in the city center
(quality of time spend in the city center, more ped. quality)
- Good quality crossings & more safety for pedestrians
- guidance and orientation system
- Image and raising awareness



Interventions: „Weiz good on foot - in the mobility chain”

Pleasant interfaces / mobility alternatives


- 2 new train stations in the citycentre of Weiz (display, timetable, seating options, toilet,...) → coming soon: weather protection, WLAN?
 - P&R & „Hubs“ outside → less traffic in center
- needed: coordinated timetables (connections in the evening – culture,)
- quality on the way to the public transport (orientation, surface, benches, way-finding, etc.)



„Weiz good on foot - in the mobility chain”

increase quality of the center: less cars

- Pedestrian friendly inner city centre
- more space to stroll (River Weizbach)
- expand pedestrian zone (e.g.: Dr. Karl-Renner G., Bismarckg., Ledererg.)
& more space (loading, trees, etc.)
- Liveable streets: increase quality of surface & street furniture: centre & neighbourhood
- → renovate pedestrian infrastructure (e.g.: Rathausg., Wielandg., already done)
- improvement of „lively Birkfelder Straße“ (shared space, way for pedestrians to railstation)
- „counting machine“ for pedestrians (ECO-COUNTER at Europa Allee & Bridge)



„Weiz good on foot - in the mobility chain”



guidance and orientation system

- ...minutes to school, center, places of culture, etc.: from new public transport stations – 10 signs



increase image and awareness, planned

- „Alles geht zu Fuß in Weiz“ campagne
- Awareness action: Parents stop

Good quality crossings and more safety for pedestrians


- traffic light: pedestrian friendly
- new schoolway plan, hazard lights at crossings



- **Workshop primary school**, walking-tour class 3B, 21 kids, 06/04/2018
- **Audit** „Sommergespräch“ **neighbourhood** Schnitzlergasse, 30 participants, 21/08/2018
- **Questionnaire results:** **115**
 - customers 06/06/2018: 44
 - school 21/06/2018: 22
 - centre Oct. 2018: 42
 - Schnitzlergasse: 31/08/2018: 7
